



OMA reports 1.35 million passenger traffic in February 2022

Mexico City, Mexico, March 4, 2022—Mexican airport operator Grupo Aeroportuario del Centro Norte, S.A.B. de C.V., known as OMA (NASDAQ: OMAB; BMV: OMA), reports that terminal passenger traffic at its 13 airports increased 68.6% in February 2022, as compared to February 2021. Domestic traffic increased 63.1%, and international traffic increased 123.1%.
